Register to Vote in the 2024 Election



It is important to note that a new Florida law requires those who wish to vote by mail to request ballots after each general election. If you have requested a new mail ballot after November 2022, you can vote by mail in the 2024 election.

If you haven't done so yet, you need to contact the Palm Beach County Supervisor of Elections to request a vote by mail ballot.

You can register to vote, view or update your voter information online at VotePalmBeach.gov. To submit paper voter registration forms, visit local voting agencies which are available throughout the county at local libraries, supervisor of election offices, driver license offices, public assistance offices, disabilities offices, Armed Forces recruitment offices, centers for independent living and entities authorized by the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission to issue fishing, hunting or trapping permits.

REQUEST IT

Deadline to request a Vote-by-Mail ballot is 5:00 p.m. on Thursday, August 8, 2024. Vote-by-Mail ballot pickup is not available from August 10th through August 20th unless, due to an emergency, the voter is unable to go to a designated early voting site or to his or her assigned polling place on Election Day (See F.S. §101.62(3)(d)(5)).

Please have your Driver License, Florida ID card, or the last 4 digits of your Social Security number available when making your request.

RETURN IT

Mail your Vote-by-Mail ballot using pre-paid postage, or drop it off inside any of our four offices during business hours. You may also drop it off at designated drop off locations across the county starting August 10, 2024.

TRACK IT

Voters can sign up for BallotTrax at VotePalmBeach.gov or by scanning this QR code to get alerts via email, text (SMS), and/or voice message with updates about the status of their ballot or if there is an issue so that it can be corrected right away.



**Your ballot must be received at the Main Elections Office by 7:00 p.m. on Election Day, August 20, 2024. **

IEARLY VOTING

Saturday, August 10, 2024, through Sunday, August 18, 2024 Polls are open from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m.



Registered voters in Palm Beach County can vote at any Early Voting location. You may drop off your Vote-by-Mail ballot in-person at one of our four (4) Elections Offices, at a secure ballot intake station, or at any Early Voting location during Early Voting hours.

IELECTION DAY

Election Day is Tuesday, August 20, 2024. Polls are open from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m.

On Election Day, you must vote at the polling place that is assigned to your precinct. Polling places may change! Visit **VotePalmBeach.gov** to confirm your polling place before you go vote.

The deadline to register to vote or change your party: July 22, 2024







Lyons Road Update



I'm pleased to announce that we are in the home stretch of construction to widen Lyons Road from two to four lanes from the LWDD L-38 Canal north to Atlantic Avenue. While we hoped paving

would be completed this week, weather and mechanical issues impacted the schedule. Due to inclement weather, the contractor lost 12 days in June and 10 days in July.

Equipment repairs are expected to be completed this week, allowing paving to begin again and continue daily until Friday, Aug. 16. At that point, nighttime paving operations will begin and are expected through Wednesday, Aug. 21, on all dates, weather permitting.

How often does the county mow the sides of the roads and medians?
