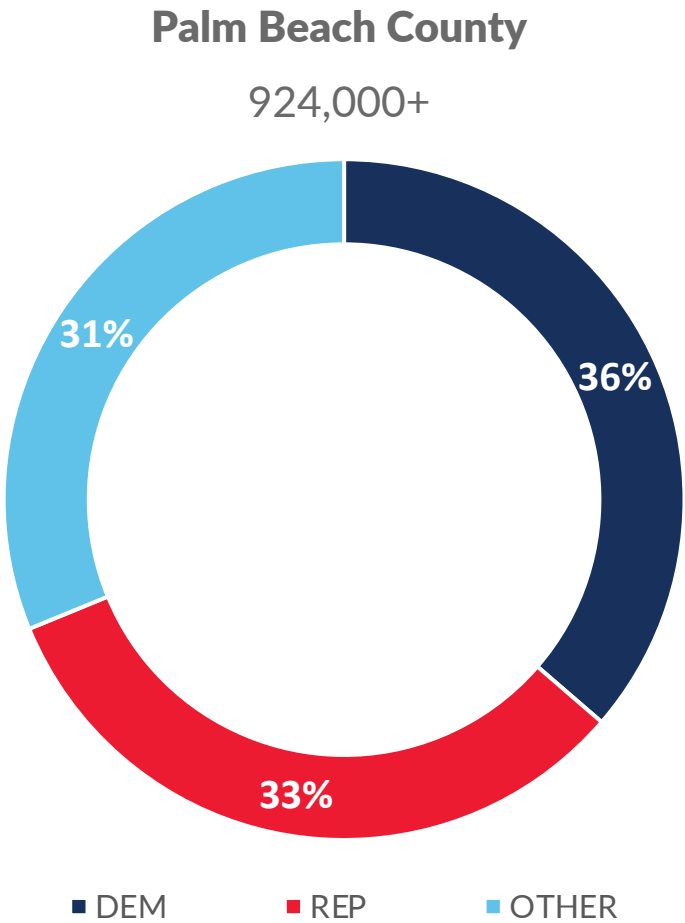
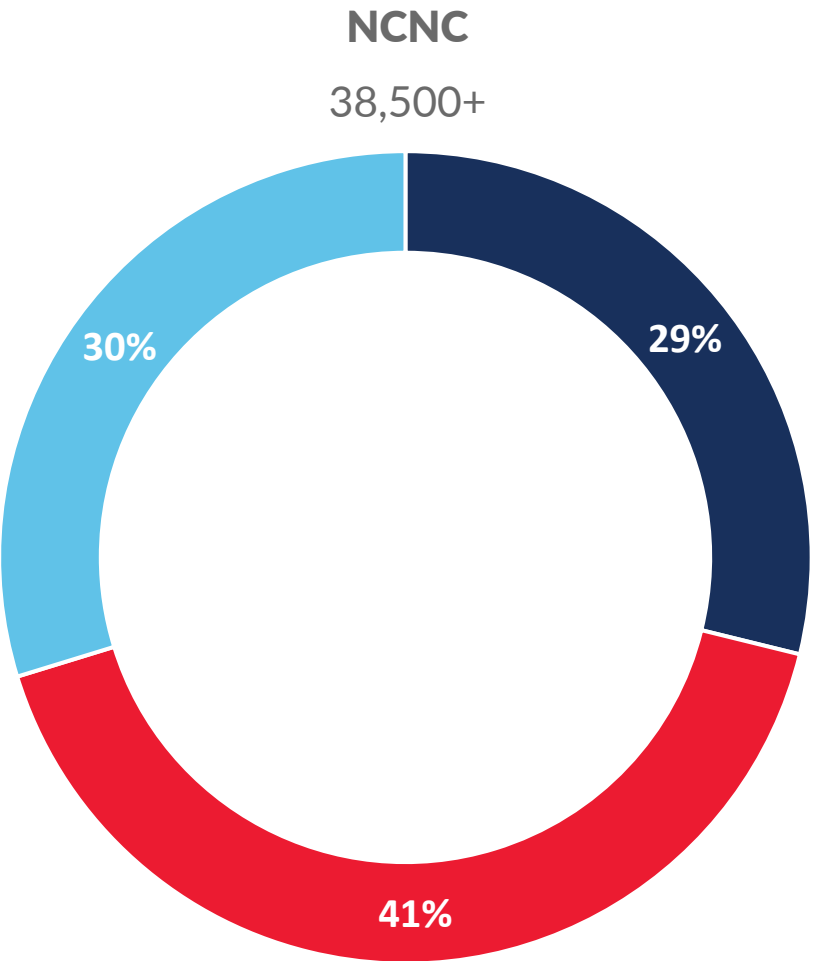

**as of 4/1/25*



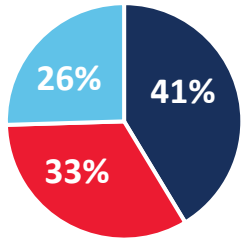

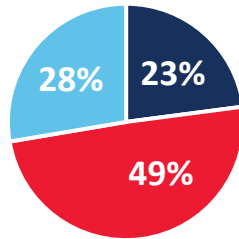

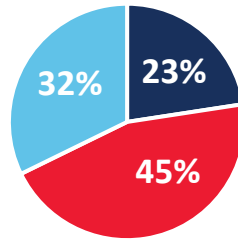

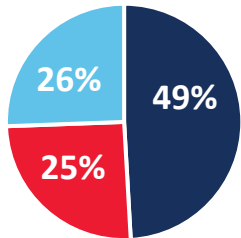

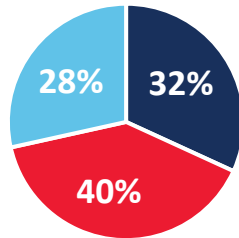

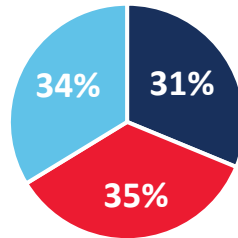

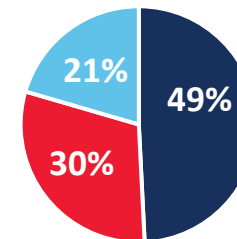

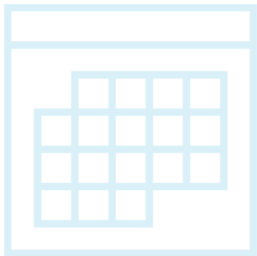


Timing of Municipal Elections

(fatigue & confusion)
- ✓ Lower cost to municipality

- ✓ Municipal Charters
- ✓ Focus on local issues
- ✓ Historical precedent (consistency)
- ✓ Lower cost to candidate

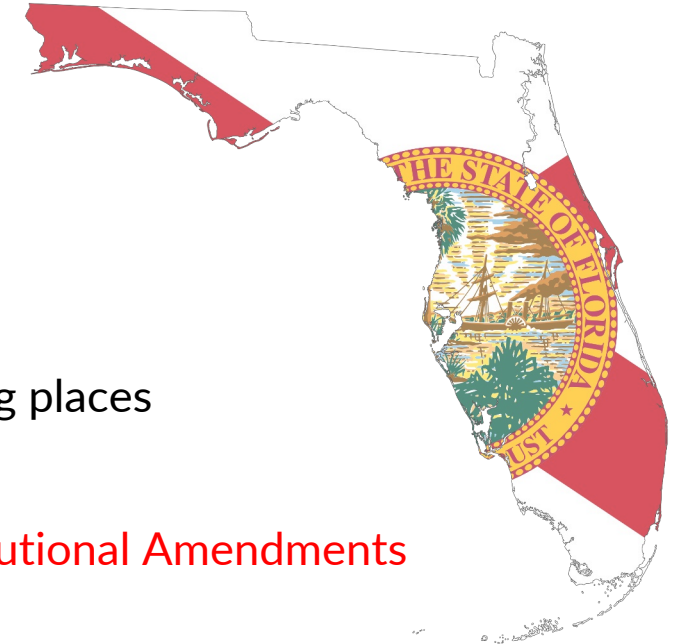

- Vote-by-Mail ballot deadlines
- Federal review of state voter rolls





Recent Changes to Vote-by-Mail

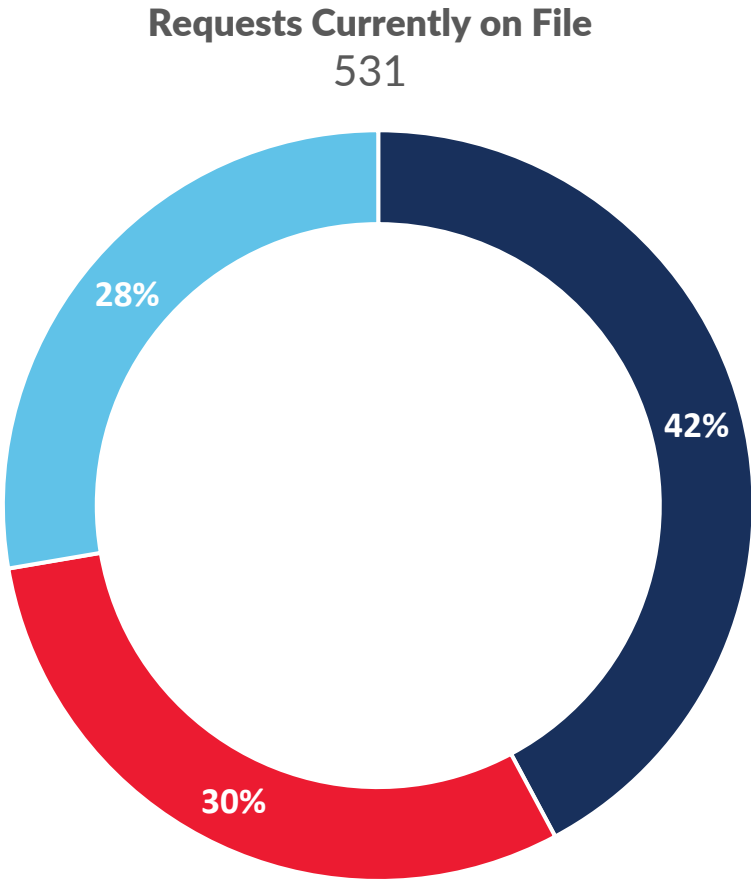
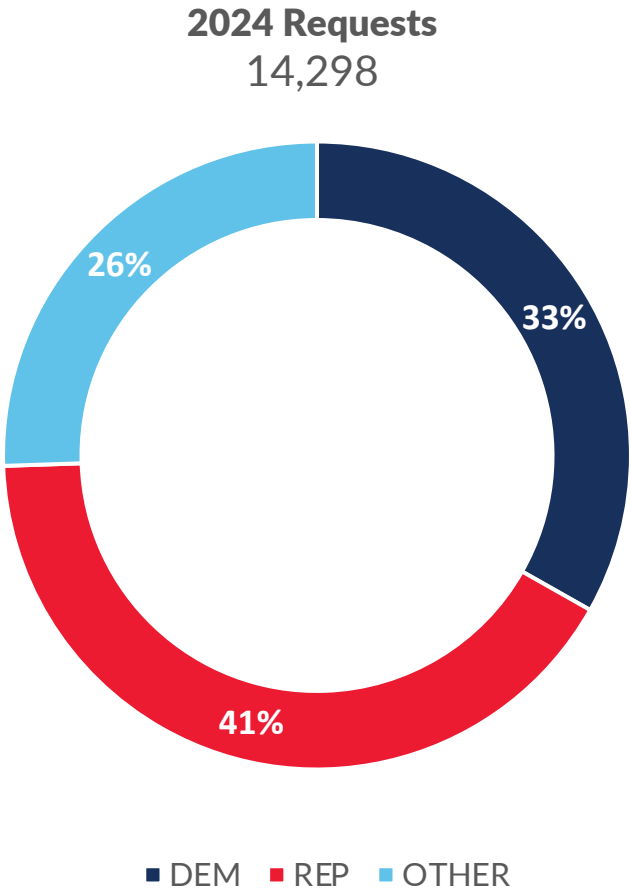
Requests expire after each General Election!



- Voters who wish to receive a Vote-by-Mail ballot for 2025 – 2026 elections are required to complete a new request.
- You can request a mail ballot for a specific election or for all elections through the next General Election.
- After the next General Election, you will need to make the request again.
